Rights Respecting Classroom

The three rights Springfield have chosen to focus on are

- **Article 12 - Every child has the right to say what they think in all matters. (Green part of rainbow)**
- **Article 28 - Every child has the right to an education. (Indigo)**
- **Article 29 - Every child has the right to develop their personality, talents and abilities. (Orange)**

- **Golden rules and rights are reflected in the good behaviour of the children.**
- **Pupils respect and value each other.**
- **Children's views are listened to and acted upon.**
- **Language of rights is used in the classroom.**
- **Children feel safe.**
- **They understand these are the rights of children around the world (The Gambia).**
